We are an NGO registered under Rajasthan Societies Act No. 28 of 1958 in the year 2016. Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan mainly works on health, education, environment, livelihood, employment, desertification and climate change, infrastructure development, providing basic necessities like food, shelter, etc. to widows, orphans, disabled and destitute people and building houses for poor people.

Currently, NSSS is taking care of 240 orphans, 610 widows, 150 disabled people, 50 senior citizens and 25 other needy/poor people, some of whom are suffering from serious diseases like cancer. We have an active presence in the states of Rajasthan, Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh with our staff, workers and volunteers.

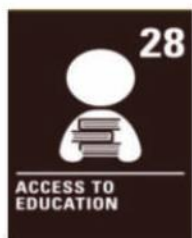

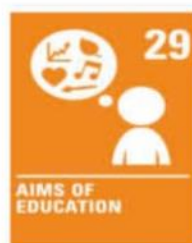

We did surveys and targeted the needy community like Orphans, Widows, Physically Disabled people, poor people and in need people and distributed grocery kits to them. We are taking care of and supporting the growth of more than 180 orphans. Our primary focus is the orphans living in rural areas or the orphans asking for help in need. We also providing training on organic farming to increase production to achieve SDG goal number 2.

On 1st January 2024, Dhruv Education and Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan organized a New Year celebration event for orphans, widows and disabled children. During the event, grocery packets were distributed and breakfast and lunch were provided to the children. Various activities and dance sessions were organized with the children, which made them very happy. Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan expressed its gratitude to Dhruv Education for their efforts and support.



Guddi and Shakuntala are both girls whose parents passed away when Guddi was two years old and Shakuntala was three months old. Their grandmother took care of both the girls. For the last 17 years, I have been raising these girls with the help of donors and bhamashas. Guddi passed class 12 with 74% marks, and Shakuntala passed class 10 with 60% marks in 2024. Guddi wants to become a teacher, while Shakuntala dreams of becoming a doctor. Both the girls are very talented and hardworking. They live in Andhi village of Jamwaramgarh block of Jaipur district.

Quality Education

Remedial Classes

Children's education should help them fully develop their personalities, talents and abilities. It should teach them to understand their rights and respect other people's rights, cultures and differences. It should help them to live peacefully and protect the environment.

NSSS started regular remedial classes to support the education of children in rural areas with the support of local donors. Its basic aim is to make children aware of the importance of education and how a well-educated person is an asset to society. Then we connect the children to our education center. We also save them from bad activities like begging, rag picking, harmful drugs, etc. Our main target was underprivileged children (orphans, widow children or poor children) living in slums, villages and poor areas. We registered many children in nearby schools and provided them with stationery kits. From time to time we also followed up with the students and tried our best to fulfill their needs.

We are running a remedial class Centre in Rana Basti Kunda Amer.

20 children were admitted to government schools.



Quality Education Remedial Classes



Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan, under its initiative "Ek Kadam Bhikshavriti se Shiksha ki Aur", organised remedial classes for the begging children in Rana Basti Kunda, which aims to connect these children with education. Under this initiative, the children were taken on a picnic to participate in the annual program at Arya College Kukas, where they enjoyed a lot. After the program, the children were served delicious food at a restaurant, which made them very happy. After the meal, the children were sent back to their homes. Such picnic programs greatly increased the enthusiasm of the children and they started attending classes regularly.

Quality Education



Jaisalmer, known for its majestic forts and rich cultural heritage, has also become a promising hub for education, especially for young girls. Efforts to ensure regular school attendance and facilitate admissions for girls are flourishing in the region. With dedicated initiatives aimed at encouraging families to enroll their daughters in schools and organizing visits to schools, the number of admissions for girls is on the rise. This concerted endeavour is transforming Jaisalmer into a conducive environment where every girl has the opportunity to pursue her education and realize her dreams.

Group Marriages Program for Marginalized Aliased People



Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan, the organization behind these events, plays a crucial role in arranging and facilitating the weddings. They ensure that all necessary arrangements, such as wedding attire, rituals, and feasts, are taken care of, allowing the couples to focus on their special day without worry. This charitable initiative highlights the organization's commitment to social welfare and community service.

Keeping in mind the culture of Rajasthan, marriage is considered a sacred festival here, in which orphans, helpless, disabled widows and daughters of women who were widowed during the Corona period are married.

According to mythological beliefs, the marriage of daughters of poor orphans, and helpless, disabled widows is a sacred and serviceable act from the social point of view and to reduce the evils and dowry system prevalent in society, mass marriage festivals are organized and for the people of lower class. It also protects people's children from social inequality by giving them equal rights in society and eliminating discrimination.

We serve according to the needs of society. The life of a poor people is very tough and when it comes to marriage the situation worsens. therefore we came up with the responsibility to arrange their marriages. The process begins after selecting the beneficiaries. We selected orphans, Handicaps, Widows and adults from financially weak families. We arranged all the needs of the program by raising crowdfunding. We purchased 7 sets of basic household items like Almira, a Dressing Table, Bed, Chair, T.V., Iron, Mixer, Utensils, Fan, Sewing machine, cooler, bucket, etc. Along with a set of household items, every couple got the wedding dress. On the wedding day, a local volunteer team and the NSSS members organized the program at Durga Mata Mandir, Near Hotel Siv Vilas, Kukas, Jaipur Rajasthan.

- Rajasthan has several regions greatly affected by desertification, notably Churu, Bikaner, Hanumangarh, Phalodi, Jaisalmer, Barmer, and Jodhpur.
- Life in these areas is challenging due to water scarcity, lack of educational facilities, and unreliable income sources.
- Approximately 33% of the Earth's land is desert, with Rajasthan encompassing 61.11% of India's desert area.
- Organizations like ours are working in districts such as Jaisalmer, Barmer, Bikaner, Jodhpur, and Phalodi to address these issues.
- Residents face difficulties accessing water, education, and stable income sources, relying heavily on seasonal agriculture.
- Our organization conducts surveys and engages with communities to understand their needs, particularly focusing on education and livelihood improvement.
- We have identified challenges in education, including long distances to schools, lack of facilities like water, toilets, and classrooms, making education inaccessible for many children.
- Despite these challenges, our organization works closely with communities to promote education, provide training in modern agricultural techniques, and empower women farmers.
- By collaborating with farmers and communities, we aim to improve agricultural practices and ensure the safety and advancement of their livelihoods.

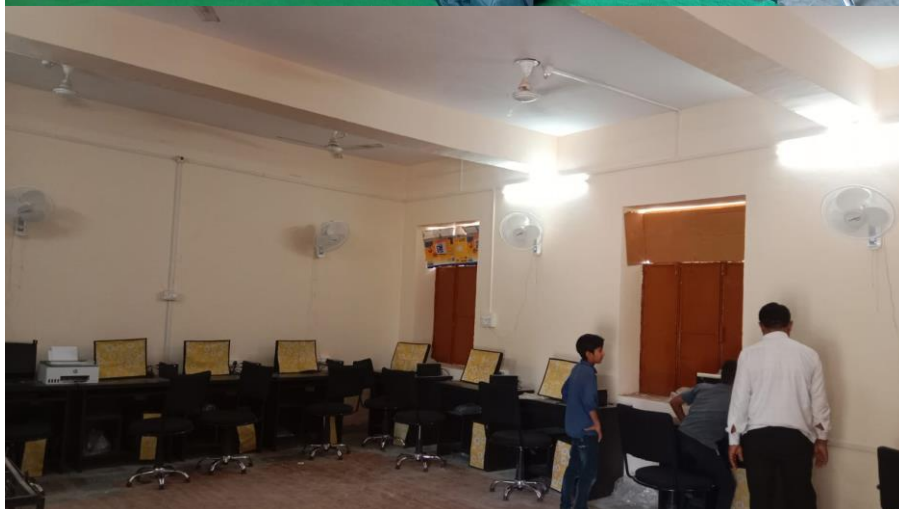


Survey and need assessment of the Kharana school building

IMPACT STORIES – A success story of Raju devi



Here, we highlight the success story of one such woman, **Raju Devi**, from the Jamwa Ramgarh tehsil of Jaipur district. Raju Devi, a resident of Gram Pata Panchayat Bhavan, utilized our schemes with great struggle and determination. Today, she is a successful woman with a large house of her own. She excels in saree embroidery work and employs over 100 women in this craft, in addition to engaging in animal husbandry. Her monthly income now exceeds ₹20,000. She educates her three children and helps other women find employment. This is the sustainability and impact of the Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan project.



For the past nine years, Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan has been working on a Women Empowerment Project. The project has helped over 50 self-help groups become self-reliant. Women in various villages within the blocks of Jamwa Ramgarh, Amer, Chomu, Govindgarh, Kotputli, Shahpura, Jhotwara, Harmada, and other areas of Jaipur district have been skilled and provided with setups for their livelihood. The main objective of the organization is to make women economically independent, ensure their good health, and enable them to educate their children and improve their surroundings. As part of this initiative, the organization has made over 1600 women self-reliant so far.

IMPACT STORIES — A success story in the words of Kiran Saini



Many families lost their loved ones during the coronavirus pandemic. Among them was Kiran Devi Saini, who lost her husband. Nath Sanskriti Seva Sansthan conducted a survey in the district to assess the impact of COVID-19 on the affected families and determine ways to assist them. The organization surveyed 225 families and identified 105 widows in need of help. They proposed a plan to Hero MotoCorp, which approved the Hero for Humanity project under its CSR initiative.
